THIS 'N THAT FROM YOUR DISTRICT DIRECTOR

I have just returned from the Spring NABC in Louisville, Kentucky - a great tournament. The Host group did a wonderful job of promoting and then following through with spectacular friendship and hospitality; Churchill Downs is beautiful even when it isn't the Kentucky Derby; the Louisville Slugger Museum where the majority of the Major League baseball players bats are made; the many restaurants not only within walking distance but delicious are only some of the features of this truly fun city. I, of course, had to sample a few Mint Juleps and they were a highlight of the trip! The attendance was over 9500, slightly under estimate and if only the room rate had been more acceptable we would have had over 10,000 tables.

News from the Board Meetings: Grim, grim and grimmer. There was a big push to not pay \$1 a member dues to the World Bridge Federation. Several members of the Board of Directors feel that this is too much to pay. It's something like saying - I want to be a member of the ACBL but \$32 a member is too much. I want to pay \$25 - that's all it's worth to me... Well - that doesn't work. Then there was the sug-

gestion to take the \$1 dues money paid to the WBF from the monies that are raised for the International Fund which is used to fund our US players in to Open, Senior and Women's events and then use what is left over to fund these players. Both of these motions were resoundingly defeated but not without a lot of unpleasant back and forth.

Next was a motion to take the \$50,000 given to the United States Bridge Federation for funding the Junior Teams and raised in Junior Fund Games and only give it as requested from the USBF. The Junior Fund raises over \$200,000 most years and uses this money to support the School Bridge Series both in US and Canada giving \$50,000 to the USBF to fund the Junior Teams - coaching and sending them to the World Championships. This motion was deferred to get more information.

District 3 has great events coming up. Play in the GNT's in While Plains on April 9th. Betty Ann Smith plans a beautiful buffet lunch starting at 11:30 am with the 4 different Flights of teams starting at 12:30pm. A short early break for food - lots of good restaurants within 5 to 10

minutes of the church and then a second session. Flight B & C conclude that day and Flight A and the Super Flight are likely to continue past that day at a convenient time for those involved. A great opportunity to earn Gold points and represent District 3 at the National Finals in Toronto this summer.

Following the GNT's we have 2 great Regionals.... June 13-19 in Saratoga Springs at the Hilton and our new location - we're back at the Sheraton Tara, now called the Sheraton Parsippany (just 10 minutes from the Fairfield location) on August 8-14. Both locations feature 2 Golden Opportunity Pairs and the Sheraton Parsippany will feature a Compact KO team event on Monday evening with the second session on Tuesday at 9am. We think this will be more fun for our players than the Bracketed KO teams.. So get your team together for the inaugural event.

Enjoy the Spring and Summer and make sure playing bridge is in your plans. Hope to see you at all our events.

The Well-Played Game ...on a personal note

The well-played game is an experience that provides access to the emotion of joy beside which the delight of winning is almost pale. The well-played game conveys the notion of excellence. It is excellent because of the way it is played. When we are playing well we are at our best; innovative, magical, and fully engaged. Yet we are only playing.

The outcome of the game and the degree to which we play well often go hand in hand, but they are independent of each other. Occasionally we will not play well and win. This happens when others probably played worse than we did. It is generally a time for both exuberance and humility. Occasionally, we will play well and not win. This is generally a time for self-confidence and acceptance. It may also be a time for learning. For example, inexperienced players may play well and lack the skill or ability to execute at a level that was required for a more successful outcome. Nevertheless they did the best they could and, therefore, played well. More often than not if we play well we will win. Playing well not only applies to games that we play as individuals, but also to games that we play as members of a partnership or team. In the latter there is an extra layer of responsibility in that the notion of playing well means that each person on the team invests their trust in others. At times, demonstrating empathy and compassion serve to facilitate the overall experience of the well-played game.

What do success, excellence, and perception have to do with the well-played game? Simply, the well-played game becomes excellent because of the way it is played, regardless of the outcome, and whether or not it is perceived by others. If we asked fifty people to describe their notions of success and excellence in life there would probably be at least twenty different answers. Nevertheless, they would probably have a common theme that describes success as fulfilling a purpose or goal, and excellence as being the best. Games have a purpose; play does not.

We perceive ourselves as a composite of qualities some of which are within our own control and endure over time, like our integrity and character, and some of which are not within our control and do not endure over time, like self-image, i.e. other peoples' perception of us. If we had to choose between success and excellence as to which one is more widely perceived by others of us, I think we would conclude success. Others don't always see the degree to which we excel. They may only infer it from the outcome.

There was a moment in time many years ago at the Olympics when a 16 year old swimmer for the United States was interviewed at poolside before her race. The interviewer said "Janet, at 16 you must be very anxious with the eyes of all America on you to win the gold medal for the United States. How do you feel about that?" I will always remember her reply because her answer was resonant of my own beliefs and values. She said "...I just want to get in the pool and swim my best and if, by chance, I win the gold medal, then so be it". Well, she swam her best time ever ...and, oh yes, she won the gold medal.

Winning is not the measure of excellence; playing our best is. Playing our best with the hope of winning is inherent in the well-played game; having to win is not. Winning and losing end the game; the experience of playing well is timeless. What an experience it would be to play in a game where everyone was playing well! I guess that's what is meant by ideal.
