## *Reitman Re-formatted*

As most of you know, the format of the Bob Johnke Team event has been very successful and enjoyable over the past years. This year was no exception. The Board of Directors of Unit 106 has decided to change the format of the Nelson Reitman Team event. It will be run in basically the same manner as the Bob Johnke. There will be a two-session qualifying event on Saturday, September 13th. It will be held at the Immaculate Conception Church in Mahwah, New Jersey. This is the same location as we used for the Johnke. There will be a catered dinner between sessions.

The Reitman Team event will differ slightly from the Johnke in that the Reitman will be completed "flighted." "A" Teams (no restriction in masterpoint holding) will ONLY play against other "A" Teams. "B" Teams (0-1500 masterpoints) will only play against other "B" Teams and "C" Teams (0-500 who must all be non-life masters) will only play against other "C" Teams.

Also differing from the Johnke, in the Reitman Team Event, only TWO members of the team have to be members of Unit 106, and depending upon the number of teams signing up to play, up to four teams from each flight will "survive" to continue into the "knock-out" stage during October and November. They will play knock-out matches against teams from their own flight to determine the winners of each flight who will receive awards at the Annual Dinner.

The format of the event should provide a wonderful opportunity for all participants to enjoy a full day of bridge and have a wonderful catered dinner. As members of Unit 106, if you have friends from other units that would like to come to play and enjoy our hospitality, please remember that only TWO members of each team need be members of Unit 106. Also, the BPT Prize Money bridge Tour is coming to our tournament starting with two sessions on Wednesday. If you like to win money and MPs too, try it, you will like it! My partner and I were facing Rose and her partner, Kyle Larsen. My son, Jonathan and his partner, Jenn were playing against a pair with multiple world championships under their belt, Peter Weichsel and Alan Sontag. How do you like our chances?

Nothing seemed too out of the ordinary at our table. Rose & Kyle bid a game; Rose & Kyle made a game. This happened several times. I hoped it was happening at the other table as well. ... Things were a bit different at the other table. There was excitement on the 1st board out of the box. Here's the action on board one.

Bidding spades-diamonds-spades (rather than spades-spades-diamonds), Jonathan showed a good 6-4 hand. Jenn like her Ace of clubs, the diamond shortness and nine-card fit, so she pushed on to game. Weichsel, holding KJX of trumps behind the spade bidder, and having heard his partner bid clubs twice, couldn't take a joke and pulled out the red card. On the lead of a small club, Jonathan won the ace, played a diamond to the ace, ruffed a diamond, played a heart to his ace and ruffed another diamond. Playing the ten of spades off dummy, he ducked when Sontag produced the 3. When Weichsel won the jack, here was the situation.

Weichsel is now endplayed. He can't play a trump. If he plays the king of hearts, declarer ruffs that, and declarer gets to execute a nice steppingstone maneuver. He plays ace and another spade, and LHO must lead a heart to the queen, which provides a parking place for declarer's losing club. In practice, Weichsel played a low heart, declarer went up with the queen and claimed five. Plus 690 gained us 7imps, and we won the match. The moral of the story is: "Don't mess with the kid!"

## TIPS FOR NEW PLAYERS THE DUMMY REVERSAL

By Barkley Calkins

When declaring a suit contract, it is usually desirable to use trumps in the hand with the shorter suit to ruff losers from the hand with the length in trump. There are some hands on which it is better to use the long suit to ruff losers, and then use the short trump to finish drawing trump. To accomplish this play, called a dummy reversal, since the dummy in essence becomes the master hand—the declarer needs:

- 1— a short suit in his own hand and
- 2— strong enough trumps in the dummy to complete the process of pulling trump after the ruffing in hand is complete

In a recent game at the Rockland Bridge Center, Shelly Schneider, a regular player there, spotted the importance of the dummy reversal in order to make his aggressive slam.

Other auctions are also possible, but the N/S route to the spade slam was a good one. Following the opening trump lead, Shelly realized his prospects were good. If trumps were 2-2, he could discard two losing hearts from dummy on clubs, concede a heart, and ruff his last 2 hearts in dummy. Even if trumps were 3-1, he could draw them and take a double finesse in hearts, making the slam anytime west held at least one of the 2 missing heart honors, normally about a 75% chance.

It can be seen however, that on this day, neither the 2-2 trump break, nor the split heart honors were to materialize, and any routine play was thus due to fail. Happily for his result, Shelly recognized the circumstances were right for a dummy reversal; i.e. he held a short suit in his own hand and high trumps in the dummy.

He thus proceeded as follows: opening spade lead won in dummy with the nine, diamond ruff with the ace, spade ten to the jack—East showing out—diamond ruff with the king, jack of hearts to East's queen, club return to dummy's king, ruff the last diamond with the queen, now heart to the ace, jack of spades drawing West's last trump with declarer discarding a heart, now 3 top clubs throwing the last 2 hearts from dummy, and finally, last heart ruffed with dummy's last spade. Altogether, declarer had made 3 top spades, 3 ruffs in hand, 1 ruff in dummy, 4 top clubs, and 1 top heart for the necessary 12 tricks.

Note: that on the actual lie of the cards, if the declarer does anything other than to win the opening trump lead in dummy and immediately lead a diamond to be ruffed, the slam cannot be made.

Well done, Shelly!!!

MORAL: Sometimes it pays to make the dummy the master hand.
