**Routes 80 East and 95 North** –Take local lanes to Exit 71. Make a right onto Broad Ave. Broad Ave. will turn into Dana Pl. Continue on Dana Pl. to the end. ## Tips for New Players Recognize the Dangerous Opponent By Barkley Calkins

As declarer, it is often critical to be alert to situations in which one opponent is safe to have on lead while the other is dangerous. A good example of one such situation arose in a recent club game.

Opening Lead: 3 of Spades

The bidding was straightforward and the final contract is a good one. South's no trump overcall showed 15—18 HCP. With 10 HCP and a long diamond suit that could be a source of tricks, North has a good raise to 3 no trump.

After the opening lead, South follows the general rule of planning the play of the hand in a no-trump contract by counting winning tricks. Here, he can count only six, 2 each in hearts and diamonds, one each in spades and clubs. Dummy's long diamond suit clearly represents the best potential source of the necessary additional tricks.

But how should the diamond suit be played? Looking at the nine card suit in isolation, the general rule is not to finesse, but to play the ace and the king, hoping for the drop of the queen. Remember "eight ever, nine never."

In this case, however, looking at the whole hand, declarer should realize that there is a good reason to ignore the general rule. Having won the opening lead in his hand with the ace, leaving queen and one in dummy, it is now dangerous to have West on lead, while East is safe.

Recognizing East is safe to have on lead, the correct play in diamonds is the ace followed by the 10, letting it ride if West does not cover. On the actual lie of the cards, the finesse wins; declarer brings in the whole diamond suit, and winds up making one or two overtricks, depending on the defense. On a different lie of the opponent's cards, the diamond finesse might lose to East, but that defender can do no damage since dummy's queen-X of spades is a stopper.

Had declarer played the ace and king of diamonds and conceded a diamond trick to West, another spade lead through dummy's queen would have been fatal.

Note that a trick one, declarer **MUST NOT** put up the queen from dummy and **MUST NOT** hold up his ace. Either of these plays would leave declarer with only a single stopper in spades rather than a double stopper.

**MORAL:** When planning the play, be alert to situations in which there is a dangerous opponent, and consider ways to keep that opponent off lead.

## Lots of Help By Fred Weidmann

Sometimes an opponent makes a slip which helps you make an un-makeable hand. But how many slips can one opponent make on a hand to benefit you?

As you can see, I opened one club and partner never let go until I was in 6 NT, which looks hopeless. But... I had West on my side. The one spade overcall was iffy, but it had the effect of locating cards. Perhaps 2 spades would have been better. The double of 6 clubs was pointless. The king is located and West will probably be on lead.

West led the 9 of diamonds. I won in hand and since she had been eager to double six clubs, I led one and after much thought (I think), she ducked and the queen won. Now I thought her hand might contain a doubleton or even singleton king of hearts, so I came to my hand with a diamond to lead a small heart to the queen. I was quite surprised as East won and shot back a club which I won with the Ace. Then I cashed 2 more diamonds throwing a club from my hand as West threw a spade and the nine of hearts, a curious card. Had West started with 5-3-1-4 pattern or was it 6-2-1-4? She had already thrown 2 spades and apparently thought she could not spare another so she threw the nine of hearts which did not appear to be of much value. This proved to be her ultimate undoing as I finessed the eight of hearts, cashed the jack and led to the king of spades whereupon the Ace of hearts squeezed West in this position.

How many errors did West make? I count 4. But I still probably wouldn't have written about this hand if it hadn't ended with a squeeze!

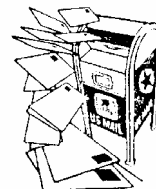
