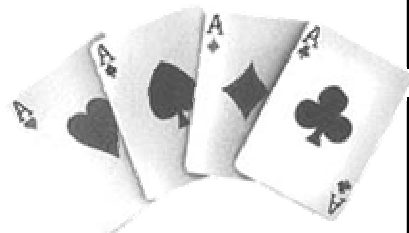

A MIDSUMMER'S NIGHTMARE OR DREAMING AT THE NATIONALS

Things were looking dismal for our Swiss team on that day
We lagged by just about an IMP with 3 more boards to play
So when we tried the first of these at 3 no trump, down one
It looked like things had worsened and that all our hopes were gone
The second deal was rather worse, the contract was six spades
Twas bid by the opponents, double and was surely made
And while we'd picked up partners whose name threw us for a loss
(Does anyone know Jim Becker and a guy called H. Chandross?)
We though they played quite steadily— their game earned little shame
Although we would much rather play with 2 who have more fame
We each had near a hundred points and wanted 2 much better
Though Howard clearly played a lot and Jim was a go-getter
In spite of that, things looked quite black with just one hand to go
We'd have to shoot to cause a swing, if we would get to crow
So when I picked up my last hand, 'twas pleasing what I saw
I thought we had a chance to gain with what was in my paw.

My partner's bid was easy since she does nave NINETY (black)
She didn't want to bid 2 clubs, so she made a heart attack
North thought it best to hold his tongue, he held a red suit stash

But at my turn, with other plans, I uttered "Diamonds six"
I felt it might be right although someone might holler "nix"
Fair South had naught to stew about, she said "I'll bid six spades"

But partner knew, (it just seemed right) she could stir up some trouble,
She found just one more pushy bid— and simply murmured
"double"

Pass, pass, it went with all of that—my hand a bursted bubble
But South thought she knew what to do and out came "I redouble"
Then each in turn said, pass, pass, pass (it wasn't very hard)
And finally West was on lead and had to find a card
She fondled one, the ace of clubs, it might be the right thing
But after thought (she has been taught) it might set up the King

So what was left, she felt bereft, sure not a spade or heart
Then saw the light and what was right— a diamond—like a dart!
And sure enough, it wasn't tough, I knew to overtake
At last I found myself on lead, and how my hands did shake
I thought quite hard about the card I felt would turn out fine
And fumbled through my hand and found a club, it was the nine

Of course, you see, the cost to me as South wrapped up the rest
She made six spades plus X and X, we'd failed our greatest test
And sad to say that J. and H., our teammates in the game
Got to six spades redoubled, so the bidding was the same!
But with the same lead, East returned a diamond (to our loss)
The net result was two grand plus—our game had lost its gloss
We later learned the other team had quite a bit of talent,
Our pair was wed. 'Twas Dorothy and one some called Sir Alan
She was real good, that's understood, her game was hardly skittish
And Alan knew just what to do in spite of accent British
While at the other table, oh my God and mamma mia!
Our teammates had to play against Al Roth and one called Zia
So sad to say we didn't win, the story has been told
We failed our quest and didn't get the points of color gold
Oh somewhere in this hallowed league the defense sees the light
The teams are playing somewhere and somewhere the bids are right
Somewhere the Wests are gloating and somewhere the Easts do shout
But there's no joy at the Nationals; our team has just struck out.

A SQUEEZE WITHOUT THE COUNT
By Barkley Calkins

A hand from a recent tournament provided an opportunity for a squeeze without the count, one I am sad to report I did not find at the table, only in the post-mortem.

North's 6 spade bid was a bit on the ingenious side; still, I am sorry I did not find the way to make him look like a genius.

Had West guessed to lead a club, there would have been no story, but the natural lead was the diamond king, providing a temporary reprieve. The winning line of play now was to win the diamond ace, ruff a diamond high, spade three to the ten in dummy, ruff dummy's last diamond high, now lead out the king and queen of spades, low heart to the king and run the rest of dummy's trumps. This produces the following four card ending:

♠ — ♥ Q ♦ J ♣ 83	♠ 2 ♥ 4 ♦ — ♣ QJ	♠ — ♥ J7 ♦ — ♣ AK
	♠ — ♥ A10 ♦ — ♣ 76	

Declarer now leads dummy's last spade and watches East's discard; if it is a heart, declarer discards a club and leads a heart to the ace, dropping the queen and jack, and setting up the ten. If East discards a top club, declarer discards the heart ten and leads one of dummy's clubs; East wins and must lead a heart to declarer's ace; dummy's other club honor now takes the essential 12th trick.

I gave up on the hand too quickly by conceding down one. Even if I could not visualize the full four card ending, it would not have hurt to run ALL of dummy's trumps to create a pseudo-squeeze. East's discards might have clarified the situation.

MORAL: NEVER GIVE UP THE SHIP!!
